Clarification

I never requested a review of "each charge" on my last lithotripsy on 8/9/2009 at Los Gatos Community Hospital (LGCH). I requested a simple uncomplicated review comparing the total billing amount of each individual lithotripsy I've had at LGCH over the years. And I've had many of them since the 80's. And if that's too much to ask for, to simply compare it to the total billing amount of the last two there. After which I would like an explanation as to why the price doubled on them just after you purchased them.

This is not a trivial matter, the purchase of LGCH resulted in a Grand Jury Investigation of El Camino Hospital.

"Litho-I" aka "Western Kidney Stone Center" as it was better known as, at LGCH billed at the fair market rate for their lithotripsies. And over the decades since the 80's, was a very successful business venture that was profitable for Tenet (previous LGCH owner). There was absolutely no justifiable reason to double the list price on them other than emergency patients like myself had to pay it. Fully, and in advance. And being uninsured, it meant at TRIPLE the fair market price.
